Finishing Craft

Where details make the difference: Mastering of textile finishing and presentation

This four-year elective course focuses on the decorative, functional, and professional finishing of textile and garment products. Students learn how to transform a completed piece into a market-ready product through advanced finishing techniques, quality control, and creative detailing.

The course enhances both technical precision and artistic flair, equipping learners with valuable skills for self-employment, fashion retail, and personalized product development.

What Students Will Learn

Students develop key skills in garment refinement and final presentation:

- Form I: Introduction to finishing tools and safety, pressing techniques, decorative stitching, and basic fabric embellishment.
- Form II: Buttoning, hemming, edge finishing, and use of accessories (lace, beads, zippers).
- Form III: Hand embroidery, applique, branding techniques, labeling, and packaging.

- Form IV: Quality control, advanced garment customization, sustainable finishing practices, and client-focused presentation.

Learners use sewing machines, hand tools, pressing equipment, embroidery kits, and basic packaging materials.

Assessment & Support

- 30% Continuous Assessment: Through practical projects, samples, and presentation of finished items.
- 70% Final National Examination (Form IV).
- Parents' Role: Support creativity at home, provide materials, and encourage quality craftsmanship.
