Confidence through creativity: Styling skills for beauty and self-expression

This four-year elective course trains students in the fundamentals of professional hair care and styling. It combines theory and hands-on practice in cutting, braiding, treatment, and customer service, preparing learners for careers in salons, beauty businesses, and personal grooming services.

The course promotes hygiene, creativity, communication, and business awareness—key for success in the personal care industry.

What Students Will Learn

Students progressively develop styling and client service skills:

- Form I: Introduction to hair types and scalp care, salon tools and safety, basic washing and sectioning.
- Form II: Braiding, cornrows, twisting, and natural hair styling techniques.
- Form III: Haircutting basics, styling with heat tools, hair treatments, and scalp massage.
- Form IV: Advanced styles, color and chemical treatments, customer service,

business setup, and branding.

Learners work with combs, scissors, clippers, hair products, mannequins, and salon equipment.

Assessment & Support

- 30% Continuous Assessment: Practical demonstrations, client simulations, and grooming projects.
- 70% Final National Examination (Form IV)
- Parents' Role: Support materials, hygiene habits, and respect for beauty as a profession.
